



2006 Seven Terraces Pinot Noir, New Zealand – Regular Price \$19.99

Seven Terraces wines are the entry level from Foxes Island Winery, owned by John Belsham and his family. John is not only a well respected New Zealand winemaker, but also a senior wine show judge. Foxes Island is a winery located in Marlborough on land between the Awatere and Wairau Valleys known as “Fox’s Island.” The area was named after a teetotaler, William Fox, an early surveyor. The site provides near perfect conditions for cool climate viticulture. You may notice some smoky vanilla aromas on this very smooth and delicious Pinot Noir. What a value!

**2005 Chateau d'Oupia “Les Hérétiques” Vin de Pays de l’Hérault, France –
Regular Price \$8.99**

André Iché inherited an impressive 13th century castle and a large estate in the Minervois region of the Languedoc in Southern France. Minervois is located in the hills of Languedoc's northwestern corner, a bit farther away from the Mediterranean coast. After selling his juice to local négociants for many years and now in his 60’s, André was convinced by well respected French winemakers to bottle his own wine. This bottling is 100% old vine Carignane and takes its name from the Cathars, a religious sect that was wiped out in 1208. That historical event is kept alive in their culture eight centuries later.

2005 Los Vascos Cabernet Sauvignon, Chile – Regular Price \$9.99

In 1988 Domaines Barons de Rothschild (Lafite) purchased Vina Los Vascos which was founded around 1736, from the Chilean family Echenique-Eyzaguirre. For many years Domaines Barons de Rothschild (Lafite) has been acquiring wineries that they feel will produce the finest wines from each country. Los Vascos was chosen because of its location near the ocean and its exceptional soil. Cabernet Sauvignon is the grape that made the estate famous. It’s known for its supple and fleshy style with ripe aromas of strawberry and black cherry with a hint of chocolate. It’s very fruity, with a slightly spicy finish and discreet tannins.

2002 St. Francis Red, Sonoma Valley– Regular Price \$12.99

After eight years of selling his grapes to his neighbors (Jordan, Château St. Jean, Kenwood and Ravenswood), Joe Martin decided to start his own winery 1979. St. Francis was established and christened after St. Francis of Assisi, in recognition of the Saint’s role as a protector of the natural world. St. Francis maintains a winemaking philosophy that is “maximum extraction, minimal intervention.” Red is a blend of 60% Merlot , 29% Cabernet Sauvignon , 7% Cabernet Franc , 4% Zinfandel and has ripe, robust fruit flavors with spicy aromas making it a perfect match for grilled foods. Red is not a complicated wine, just fun for your summer barbecue.
