2007 Camille Cayran “Secret de Campane” Vin de Pays de la Principaute d'Orange, France - Regularly \$9.99

Cairanne is a well known wine village of the Southern Côtes du Rhône. The "Secret de Campane" comes from the vineyards located in the Principality of Orange, in Provence, (on the left bank of the Rhône river), facing the Dentelles de Montmirail and the Mont Ventoux. This medium bodied alternative to Pinot Noir is a blend of 60% Grenache, 20% Carignan, 10% Cinsault and 10% Merlot and boasts a beautiful cherry red color. The aromas are of fresh raspberries and red fruits with light pepper and cherry on the palate. The tannins are soft and approachable making it a nice match for soft cheese, pasta, and BBQ.

2007 Enrique Foster IQUE Malbec, Argentina - Regularly \$11.99

This wine is a hand-harvested, 100% Malbec from old vines, planted in 1919. The vineyards are located 3,000 feet above sea level in the Lujan de Cuyo region of Mendoza on the slopes of the Andes. Unlike most Malbecs, it is made in a new winery that is 100% gravity flow (no pumping of the wine) which most winemakers agree produces a superior wine. With fruit from 30-year-old vines, IQUE spends no time in oak. The result is a fresh and fruity wine with soft white pepper spice. It pairs well with meat, pasta and cheese.

"Fruity and forward, but airing allows restraint and character to emerge. Still, this is a red-blooded red wine with racy fruit, plenty of freshening acids, pepper and bitter chocolate at the end. Best in late 2008 into 2009." - 87 points, The Wine Enthusiast

2006 Bogle Vineyards Petite Sirah, California - Regularly \$12.99

Although the Bogle family has been farming since the mid-1800's, it was not until 1968 that the father and son team of Warren and Chris Bogle planted their first 20 acres of wine grapes in Clarksburg, California. Now, Bogle Vineyards farms over 1,200 acres of wine grapes in the Delta region. Their success is firmly rooted in one thing: the day-to-day involvement of the Bogle family in the hands-on effort to produce and promote quality wines. Petite Sirah is considered Bogle's "heritage" varietal and was first produced by them in 1978. This is a voluptuous wine, loaded with ripe berry, black pepper, and herbal aromas and flavors. It's best served with rich meat dishes of lamb, pork or game and their hearty sauces.

2005 Katnook Founder's Block Cabernet Sauvignon, Australia - Regularly \$19.99

Katnook is an aboriginal word meaning "Fat Land" referring to Coonawarra's red, fertile soil known today as "terra rossa". The unique soil of Coonawarra produces exceptional Cabernet Sauvignon, as well as stylish Shiraz, Merlot, Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc. The 2005 vintage was almost ideal and produced Cabernet Sauvignon wines with excellent color, abundant ripe fruit with generous flavors and substantial palate structures with fine lingering tannins. Winemaker Wayne Stehbens has been at Katnook's winemaking helm since 1979, making him one of Australia's longest serving winemakers. He is also one of the nation's most awarded winemakers. Wayne describes his winemaking style as "making wines which show subtlety, intrigue and complexity. Reflecting the essence of Coonawarra's terroir is integral to my winemaking approach."
