2005 Zenato Lugana, Italy – Regularly \$14.99

From the Veneto, the Zenato family and their wines are the benchmark of a region that has long cultural and historical traditions in quality winemaking. The Zenato vineyards are in the Lake Garda area of Veneto. This bottling is 100% Trebbiano di Lugana from the San Benedetto parcel on the south shore of the lake. The grapes are fermented in temperature-controlled stainless steel and refined in tanks for six months before the wine is released. The winery started with Sergio Zenato and his wife Carla as they began to produce quality wines from this indigenous varietal. It has now been passed down to their children.

2006 Culley Vineyards Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc, New Zealand – Regularly \$12.99

Neill Culley is passionate about Marlborough and is dedicated to bringing you “Marlborough in a glass.” Neill is an innovative traditionalist who is renowned for producing premium wines that represent the vineyard in which the grapes were grown. The grapes for his Culley Vineyards wines are sourced from growers he has worked with for years. This Sauvignon Blanc comes from the Yarrum Vineyard located in the Brancott Valley and the King Vineyard located in the Rapaura region of Marlborough. This wine displays vibrant gooseberry and passion fruit aromas, excellent balance, intense flavor and a lengthy finish. An ideal wine to enjoy on its own or with food.

2005 Concannon Pinot Noir, Central Coast – Regularly \$11.99

Pioneering founder, James Concannon, began making wine in the Livermore Valley, in the San Francisco Bay area, in 1883. Since then, this winery has been responsible for many “firsts.” They bottled the world’s first Petite Sirah, were one of the first wineries to bottle Bordeaux and Rhone-styled wines in California, and created the Cabernet Sauvignon Clones 7 and 8 which helped plant much of Napa in the 1970s. This *Limited Release Pinot Noir* is 85% Pinot Noir, 8% Petite Sirah and 7% Grenache is rich in color and aromas. It has vibrant flavors of black cherries and ripe raspberries that balance with the hints of leather and vanilla.

86 points – The Wine Enthusiast – *“Central Coast Pinots are usually thin, which is why Concannon blended 15% Petite Sirah and Grenache. The wine is like a Pinot Noir with its light color and silkiness, but it offers plenty of cherry candy and blueberry flavors. Fully dry, this high-production Pinot is a good value.”*

2005 Contrada Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley – Regularly \$14.99

Michael Pozzan has won acclaim for his Pozzan, Dante and Annabella wines since he began in 1981. He is also now a negotiant, purchasing grapes from some of California’s *leading wineries* and bottling his finished product under his new Contrada label. The name of this new project comes from his deep Italian winemaking heritage: Contradas are small neighborhoods found in Northern Tuscany. This full bodied Cabernet is loaded with ripe fruit flavors that are supported by a sweet/savory earthiness and a smooth, long finish. Enjoy the value of this delicious red wine!
