Red Wine

2006 Stephen Vincent Four Sisters Pinot Noir, Sonoma Coast - Regularly \$19.99

Stephen Vincent wines have become the "table wine" for many people because of their consistent quality and value. We haven't seen a new bottling from them in a while, so the release of this Pinot Noir was exciting. Although it's new to us, previous vintages were sold to a number of top Pinot Noir producers, including David Bruce and Williams Selyem. This delicious Pinot is produced from fruit grown on their Sonoma Coast Four Sisters Vineyard located a few miles west of Sonoma Valley where the high quality French burgundy clones 777, 115, Pommard, and Swan are grown. With wonderful upfront blackberry/clove flavors, the long finish is rich and full with its soft tannins.

2006 Red Knot Shiraz, Australia - Regularly \$12.99

John Davey, a veteran Australian winemaker, who has worked throughout the Barossa Valley, Langhorne Creek and Yarra Valley as well as the McLaren Vale since the early 1990s. He and his brother Kym co-manage the family's Davey Family Vineyard which is the source of most of the fruit for this wine. They also purchase grapes from their neighbors' vineyards. With a blend of 97% Shiraz and 3% Grenache this "**Best Buy**" is bursting with mocha and ripe berry flavors. Red Knot Shiraz is not only great to drink with meat, especially duck, but also your favorite chocolate dessert.

2006 San Silvestro "Ottone 1" Barbera Peimonte, Italy - Regularly \$10.99

Piedmont / Piemonte is located in the very northwestern part of Italy and means "at the foot of the mountains." This is a perfect name, as it lies at the foot of the Alps and has a culture and dialect that is closer to parts of France than other parts of Italy. The "Cantine San Silvestro" is located in the Commune of Novello in Piemonte. It's run by the fourth generation of the Sartirano family who mainly produce premium red wines and have worked to expand their distribution throughout Italy and abroad. The "Ottone 1" is 100% Barbera and bursts with ripe berries, cherries and jammy flavors making it nicely soft on the palate. This unoaked wine is a nice pairing for cold meats, pasta, red meats, chilled in summer with salads or a snack.

2005 Liberty School Cabernet Sauvignon, Paso Robles - Regularly \$16.99

Liberty School is a family-owned winery in Paso Robles, the heart of California's Central Coast. The Hope family planted wine grapes here in 1978. This unique growing region is characterized by a diversity of vineyard soils, its proximity to the coast, and a climate of temperature shifts of up to 50 degrees. For over three decades, Liberty School has been among the best values in California wine. The Cabernet Sauvignon comes primarily from the east side of Paso Robles, prime Cabernet country, with the added complexity of a few west side sources. With very generous aromas of ripe raspberries and chocolate and soft flavors of black currant and cherry, this wine is ready to drink!
