2006 Kiwi Cuvee Sauvignon Blanc, France - Regularly \$7.99

Surprise, this is NOT a New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc! It is actually from the Loire Valley of France, their third largest wine region. The most popular white varietal in the Loire Valley is Sauvignon Blanc. The crisp, citrus acidity is not quite as bold as the name "Kiwi" might imply, but refreshing non the less. It is a wonderful wine to enjoy with fish, chicken or even a garden fresh vegetarian dish.

2006 Bennett Family Chardonnay Reserve, Sonoma - Regularly \$14.99

William Grant and Sons started in the spirits business over a century ago with a small whisky distillery in the Scottish highlands. The result of this passion grew into what we now know as Glenfiddich. The Bennett Family, part of the William Grant family tree, expressed the same passion for fine wine. They chose the specific regions for their Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon to make wine worthy of the family name. Russian River Valley produces great Chardonnay and the vineyard is located in the heart of this phenomenal growing region. The cool coastal evenings allow the acidity levels to stand up to the rich tropical fruit in this truly perfect Chardonnay from the Russian River Valley. David Cronin, Winemaker, has been making wine for some of the best producers in the Napa Valley for over two decades. Utilizing his talents in grape selection, David has posted more than his fair share of 90+ point rated wine from the Wine Spectator. An expert in producing world-class Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon, David has had his hand in the success of the Bennett Family wines since their inception

2006 Altano Tinto, Portugal - Regularly \$9.99

While the Douro region is most famous for its fortified Ports, it is also considered the finest region in Portugal for producing dry red wines. Altano is made by the Warre family, the oldest Port shipping firm in the world. The wine is a blend of 70% Tinto Roriz (aka Tempranillo) and Tinto Franca grown in the Cima Corgo and Baixo Corgo sub-regions of the Douro valley. Fermentation was done in stainless steel tanks followed by aging in both French and American used oak barrels. Deep red in color with a fresh, jammy aroma, hints of clove and spice on the palate, with a well structured black fruit and soft tannin finish.

2005 Sebastiani Cabernet Sauvignon, Sonoma - Regularly \$17.99

Samuele Sebastiani emigrated from Tuscany in 1895 and by 1904 he had started a small winery in Sonoma and began bottling his wine. After his death in 1944, his son August and wife Sylvia acquired the winery and increased production dramatically. August became well known for being an innovative winemaker while Sylvia was known for her cookbooks. Sebastiani third and fourth generations are now in charge with Mary Ann Sebastiani Cuneo, their daughter, President and CEO and her son Marc, Director of Grower Relations. This Cabernet is a great example of how their wines continue to be an outstanding quality from the Sonoma Region. With 84.2% Cabernet Sauvignon; 2.7% Petite Sirah; 5% Malbec; 4.5% Merlot; 1.4% Cabernet Franc; 2.2% Petit Verdot, they are able to maintain a Bordeaux style. Well balanced with flavors of cedar, raspberry and cocoa are followed by toasty oak on the long finish. **87 Points from Wine Spectator**
